Watson Action Traffic Subcommittee

As you may be aware the subgroup has been busy this year! They have successfully launched a monitored speed sign in the estate. Based on the results of this initiative a decision will be made by DLRCoCo about reducing the speed limit in Watson's to 30KMPH. To accompany this launch speed limit corriboards were erected throughout the estate. As a final road safety reminder in 2017, a road safety leaflet is accompanying this newsletter to remind us all of our responsibilities as road users.

50th Anniversary of Watsons Estate

On 15/03/1967 Watsons Nursery was sold to Gallagher's Builders who began to build that same year, making 2017 the 50th anniversary of Watsons Estate. From 06/05/1912 to 15/03/1967 roses and fruit trees were grown throughout Watsons, which were replaced by most of our houses in the late 1960's and early to mid 1970's.



Safety at Christmas Time

Remember to be safe this Christmas. *Personal Safety Ireland* have some 'Top Tips' that are good to follow to make sure you will be as safe as possible this Christmas when you are out and about;



Also, remember to keep your house as safe as possible by asking yourself the following:

- Have I locked all doors and windows before leaving the house or going to bed?
- Did I leave lights on when I'm going out? Remember to set up some automatic timers.
- Did I lock my shed / garage?
- Do I have adequate exterior (motion sensor) lighting?
- Have I trimmed trees / shrubs so that they can't be used as hiding places for intruders?



Animals in Winter

Pets and wildlife can suffer during the cold winter months. PETA have suggested some tips for helping animals survive during winter:

- don't allow your cat or dog to roam freely outdoors
- increase all pets food rations
- clean off dogs' or cats' legs, feet, and stomachs when they come in from the snow
- if you use it, buy nontoxic antifreeze
- provide a fresh source of water for wildlife
- give wildlife a boost by leaving seed / feed out.

It's that time of year when our footpaths are likely to be icy and slippery. Bearing this in mind and in keeping with An Garda Síochána's *Operation Enable'*, we would like to ask all residents and their guests to please be careful of where you park your car.
